

2020 has been challenging for everyone, including us. The struggling transition to online COOL and all technical issues during online COOL are apparent. Our social interactions became limited, and it certainly does not help

those who are less talkative. In addition to that, life outside COOL is also challenging in general. Some students, for instance, live in a relatively small dormitory. It made it very hard for them to cope up with the lockdown and social restrictions. It is no surprise that we struggled a lot during those periods – not mentioning that students have their own challenges in transitioning to online courses.

When all the odds are against us, it can be expected that maybe people start to stop coming to COOL. It would have been not too surprising. We share our lives, our failures or successes, our shames or victories, and those kinds of things. And I like the solidity of the disciples at Eden. On top of praying for our COOL, we can actually do deep talk, about COOL, about life, and many other things. In particular, during zoom prayer, we would enjoy our sharings and fellowship afterwards.


Hopes for Eden


