

Learn to follow God's guidance for career decisions

In a world that we live today, career decisions can seem overwhelming because of the available options in front of us, more than at any other time in history. To further complicate the situation, we want to make the "right" decision, the choice that proves to be good for us and that is the one we believe God would have us make. So how do we take His will into account when contemplating a career choice or change? Is it up to God to guide or up to us to decide? The key to resolving this dilemma is realizing that it is both: God promises to guide and we are called to decide.

As far as I understand, the Bible does not address the career choice specifically. It is likely that in biblical times, career choice was not an issue. People usually went into family business or had their occupation determined by the situation God allowed them to be in. We can refer to Joseph, Daniel, and many others. However, the Bible does show us that God guides his people toward the kind of occupation and calling that pleasing Him.

Some principles from Kevin & Kay Marie Brennfleck (Christian Career Centre), advises to make wiser career decision by:

- getting closer to God until we desire to seek first the Kingdom of God and His righteousness (Matthew 6:33)
- using the minds, particular skills He has given us to the best of our ability (Romans 12:6-8) and with the inclination toward particular interests
- learning to take risks and trust God (Matthew 24:14-30)

When I reflect on my story, I also have many struggles, as I had to work in several different roles throughout the years (some of them were not quite the same as my educational background). At once, I thought it was not an ideal path. However, one thing I can testify is that God has always guided me through all of those times and it is more than enough for me to be grateful.

I have always had a passion for building construction since I was 13 years old, before I decided to study architecture after finishing high school. It was not a smooth sailing process, as I was not prepared for the requirements of the course. As soon as I started, I felt the pressure to always come up with creative ideas. Coupled with the desire to be the best in my area to please God and the tendency to compare myself with some talented classmates, soon resulting in diminished passion that I no longer enjoyed my study. During those times, I prayed to God and the way God's guidance unfolds

during my struggle was through encouragement from several spiritual mentors and lecturers. He put a personal conviction in my heart that He wanted me to stay on this path, so I decided to stay until graduation.



Those days were not easy as I had to move to two different countries, while managing work and study at the same time, but today I

The story did not stop when I found a better role that I have been enjoying for many years. God has something greater than only to guide me to that direction. I cannot remember how many times my family and friends had to listen to my complaints on working with certain personalities while being under constant pressure of deadlines. The consideration to give up the job or stay for some more years seemed very daunting. On those moments, I remembered what God said to Israelites in Deuteronomy 8:2-3: "And you shall remember the

whole way that the Lord your God has led you these forty years in the wilderness, that he might humble you, testing you to know what was in your heart, whether you would keep his commandments or not."

Through all the process, I was not lost, I was being led. God did not leave me to find my own way, but He orchestrated the circumstances in my career journey to keep me close to the ground. Looking at the big picture leads to this conclusion: our struggles throughout our career journey are not permanent, but those are God's plan for our lives. That may not sound encouraging, but remember God is leading and teaching vital lessons — humility, obedience, and dependence on Him day by day.
