GOD HAS OUR BEST INTEREST AT HEART

Through Jeremiah, God taught 2 lessons by using figs in the baskets. One basket had extremely good figs while the other basket contained rotten figs.

The good figs represented the Jews who were captured in Babylon. God was actually looking favourably upon those who had been taken captive. While they thought that they were very unlucky, God's plan was beyond that. God meant good. Jeremiah let the captives know that God had sent them to Babylon to save them and not to make them fall into disobedience. Eventually, God brought them back to the Promised Land.

The rotten figs represented king Zedekiah and all those who remained in Judah. Due to their disobedience, they would experience nothing but trouble and hardship, violent death, famine and disease. Eventually, none of them would inhabit the land of their inheritance.

Time and time again, God reminds us that we can rest in the assurance that He is a good God. The process might be painful but do not reject God. Keep holding on to your faith and trust the One who holds your future because God truly has our best interest at heart.

LISTEN TO WHAT YOU NEED TO HEAR

Both Jeremiah and Hananiah were God's prophets. Hananiah claimed that God told him that in 2 years God was going to free them from Babylon's captivity while Jeremiah said that they were going to be under Babylon for 70 years. It looked that Hananiah's prophecy was more hopeful and encouraging but was it really from God? Verses 12 to 17 write that Jeremiah was the one whom God spoke to and the one who told the truth.

Sometimes, what you want to hear is not the truth as some truth can be harsh. Or you prefer hearing and accepting something that is pleasing to your ear rather than the facts. In this case, what you want to hear is not actually what you need to hear.

As children of God, we should have the understanding of what is right and what is wrong. It is not about what you want to hear. Rather, it is about what you need to hear. When you are open to what you need to hear, it leads you to the truth. If you are only open to what you want to hear, it leads to destruction

hen you misbehave, your parents will tell you off to ensure that you do not do it again in the future. Do you know that, when your parents tell you off or scold you, it hurts their heart as much as you feel sad being scolded? But they have to do it anyway as this is one of the ways for you to grow up well and avoid any troubles in the future. You may not understand now but eventually, you will understand and will be thankful to your parents.

God's response to sin is like a parent's response to a misbehaving child. God loves us more than an earthly parent loves a child. Sins separate us from God and God loves us too much to let us stay separated from Him.
