JEREMIAH 35:12-16

TO LOVE GOD IS TO OBEY GOD

Jeremiah shared a story about Jonadab, who ordered his sons not to drink wine. Even after many years, the descendants of Jonadab still obeyed their ancestor's command. They did not drink wine. Jeremiah invited them to the temple and served some wine to them. They refused to drink it. They loved and respected Jonabad so much that even after Jonabad passed away, they still obeyed his commandment.

Obeying God is like obeying your dad. Your dad teaches you to read the Bible and pray every day, to eat healthy food, to study hard, to be honest, etc. Because you love your dad, obviously you will listen to his commands.

Obeying your parent's commands is as valuable as obeying God's commandments. Listen well to your parents and to God's commandments. Keep God's commands in your heart and do it with full integrity. To love God is to obey God.

Key verse:

John 14:23a Jesus replied, "Anyone who loves Me will obey My teaching."

JEREMIAH 36:27-33

DO NOT IGNORE OR REJECT GOD'S CALL

In Singapore, when someone is being caught eating or drinking in the MRT, he will have to pay a fine up to SGD 500. If he fails to pay, it does not mean he can get away with it and be free from the fine. He might need to face a bigger consequence.

Through Jeremiah, Baruch wrote God's word on a scroll. It was all about God's prophecies and His calling to King Jehoiakim and the people to repent before it was too late. Instead of accepting God's word and repenting, King Jehoiakim showed his disbelief in God and burned the scroll. He thought that by burning the scroll, everything written in it would not come true. He was wrong! Eventually, everything took place and he and his whole family perished.

We should be grateful when we are being reminded to repent. Do not ignore or reject His call. Because, if we do, the consequences of our sins might be worse. Don't dwell in sins. God's word is the truth and the truth can set us free from sin.

Key verse:

1 Thessalonians 4:8 So the person who refuses to obey this teaching is refusing to obey God, not man. And God is the One who gives us His Holy Spirit.

JEREMIAH 39:15-18

REWARDS FOR TRUSTING GOD

When Jerusalem started to fall and was taken over by King Nebuchadnezzar of Babylon, the Babylonians broke through the city gates, tore down the walls, burned the buildings, and took into exile those who were not killed in the battle.

But there is someone who was protected by God. He was Ebed-Melech. Through Jeremiah, God told Ebed-Melech that he would not fall by the sword during the fall of Jerusalem because he had put his trust in Him. How thankful he must have been to hear the word of Jeremiah that announced his salvation!

Ebed-Melech is notable for rescuing the prophet Jeremiah from the cistern into which Jeremiah had been cast (Jeremiah 38:7-13). Ebed-Melech was selfless for helping Jeremiah's life. He was so courageous for risking his life from being killed by the wicked king. He was a man of integrity for knowing what was the right thing to do. Above all, he trusted GOD!

As a reward, when everyone was busy fighting for their lives, Ebed-Melech was in a calm and restful situation because of God's reward of salvation to him

JEREMIAH 42:1-5 & JEREMIAH 43:1-3

THE EMPTY PROMISES

A fter the fall of Jerusalem, the remaining leaders who were left behind asked Jeremiah to pray and ask God for directions and answers. They promised Jeremiah that they would obey whatever God instructed them, whether it sounded good or bad. They even asked God to be their witness for their promises.

Ten days later, God answered. God's answer was very clear. God wanted them to stay in Judah and God would make them strong. If they went to Egypt, they would be defeated by hunger, war and disease.

Jer 43:2 writes that they accused Jeremiah of lying to them because they had already planned to run off to Egypt with the remnant, to escape from more impending disaster and famine.

How ironic that their reactions were totally the opposite of what they had said to Jeremiah 10 days before. Their promise meant nothing. It was just an empty promise.

May this story become a reminder to us not to make empty promises as it will only hurt others. Moreover, we should not make empty promises to God.

Key verse:

Matthew 5:33 When you make a promise, don't break your promise. Keep the promises that you make to the Lord.

Dear God, let me always examine my heart thoroughly before making promises so that I won't make empty promises to You and other people. Amen.

GOD'S PRIZE TO YOU

Baruch was Jeremiah's secretary who wrote all God's words through Jeremiah. After seeing all the adversities that Jeremiah went through for the sake of following God's command, Baruch started to question God about the value of his life.

God knew Baruch's heart and talked to him. God could easily break down what He had built. God could pluck up what He had planted. God encouraged Baruch to rely only on God as the One who gave him life, instead of chasing for the worldly things in life.

There is no point in seeking great things for ourselves. Let's receive God's gift of life. And that shall be as a prize to us, wherever we go. The number of likes in your Facebook, the number of followers in your Instagram or the number of views of your Insta story is nothing compared to God's prize.

JEREMIAH 48:7-13

WHO IS YOUR CHEMOSH?

This verse was God's message to Moab, who worshipped Chemosh, their god. Chemosh was the national deity of the Moabites. Jeremiah reminded them that God sent a warning to wake them up and make them repent from their sins.

Today's Chemosh could be anything other than God, everything that we are so attached to and is drifting us away from God. It could be the love of money, addiction to getting more likes in our social media posts, addiction to games or many other things that attract our hearts more than obeying God's word. These are modern gods that we might think irrelevant, but actually it can be as bad as worshipping Chemosh.

It doesn't mean that you must hate money, delete your Instagram account or stop playing games at all. We should know the purpose of our lives and use these things as tools to glorify God's name.

For example, you can give your spare money to others in need or share positive messages on social media. Sometimes, you may even play games with your friends in order to build a positive friendship. Take control of these things in your life and use them to glorify God. Otherwise, if you let these things control you, they will be a Chemosh in your life.

Key verse:

Exodus 20:3 You shall have no other gods before me.
