G od told Ezekiel that God would take away his wife from him. Not only that, God instructed Ezekiel not to mourn over the death of his beloved wife. Not being able to mourn for his wife would be a great sacrifice for Ezekiel and it caused a great pain for him in addition to his grief. Nevertheless, despite his sadness, Ezekiel did what God asked him to do.

What Ezekiel had to experience was actually a sacrifice for a greater purpose. God had a purpose that He wanted to show to the Israelites through what had happened. Speaking of sacrifice, in order to save us from eternal death, God sacrificed His Son, Jesus on the cross. Sacrifices are made for greater purposes.

When we give up something precious, we will feel the pain. However, we know that we have to do it in order to achieve something great. For example, in order to score with flying colours in our exam, we sacrifice our play time; in order to make our little sister happy, we sacrifice our last piece of cookies and give it to her.

As we grow in faith, we will be more ready to make more sacrifices in order to do what Jesus wants us to do. Remember that He has given the greatest sacrifice to save us all: Himself.

Key verse:

Romans 3:25 God presented Christ as a sacrifice of atonement, through the shedding of His blood—to be received by faith

Dear God, I want to offer my life to You as a pleasing sacrifice. Lord, have Your way in me. Amen.





WE ARE JUST MERE MORTAL

Pride has been a source of problems from time to time. Through the prophet Ezekiel, God warned the leader of the powerful coastal city of Tyre against his pride. He said the king's pride would result in his downfall.

It is true that hard work, skill and perseverance contribute to your success at school. But in addition to all that, there are other things that contribute to your success such as favourable opportunities, unexpected circumstances, perfect timing and miracles. Those things are beyond our control as humans.

So, it is not right to boast on our own strength in our success. We don't have the power to control all the circumstances, possibilities, people around us and other events on which our success depends. All these things are under God's power and control. He is God while we are mere mortal.

We should be thanking God for our achievement and success. Continue trusting Him to provide for us, to lead and guide us. Have a daily encounter with God so that we become more delightedly humble and we will get rid of our own pride.

Key verse:

Romans 1:21 For although they knew God, they neither glorified Him as God nor gave thanks to Him, but their thinking became futile and their foolish hearts were darkened.

Prayer

Dear God, the more I get to know You, the more I understand that everything I have is from You alone. I worship humbly before You, Vesus, Amen.



WHO CAN COMPARE TO YOU, GOD?

G od described Egypt as a great cedar tree that was tall, powerful, prominent and strong. Even the trees in the Garden of God could not compare to them. Yet, it became proud of itself and it came crashing down.

On the contrary, Jesus used a small mustard seed as a parable about the Kingdom of God (Mark 4:30-31). A mustard seed is usually about 1 to 2 mm. It's so tiny, but when it is well taken care of, it can grow into the largest of all trees in the garden, that can be useful for other animals, birds or even people around it.

When God is in control, one tiny element can be such a powerful influence while something that is great can become very small and insignificant. 1 Corinthians 1:27 says God chose the foolish and weak things of the world to shame the wise and the strong.


If you feel insignificant, remember that God can use you to accomplish great things for His kingdom. When you feel prideful, remember who you are compared to God's majesty.

Key verse:

2 Chronicles 20:6 Lord, the God of our ancestors, are You not the God who is in heaven? You rule over all the kingdoms of the nations. Power and might are in Your hand, and no one can withstand You.

DON'T LET THE CHANCE SLIP AWAY

This is how God's justice works on us. Just as a righteous person who ends up turning away from righteousness will be punished, likewise, a sinner who ends up turning away from his wickedness will be forgiven. That sounds more than fair. God always gives His people a chance to repent.



We might feel we are so bad because we've hurt people around us and we feel that we do not deserve forgiveness from God or others. The good news is, as long as we repent and decide to change, God will definitely forgive us. He gives us a second chance. A second opportunity. Don't let the chance slip away.

Key verse:

Ezekiel 33:16 I will not remember the bad things they did in the past, because now they live right and are fair. So they will live!

Prayer

Dear God, soften my heart, to see You in everything I do and remind me always that You are more than eager to forgive when I truly repent. Amen.



JESUS, MY GOOD SHEPHERD

Being a shepherd is not easy. His main job is to ensure the safety and the well-being of the sheep. A good shepherd will go an extra mile to take care of the flock of his sheep.

Sheep are not able to look after themselves thus they need a shepherd to guide them to the grassland and to the water, and to protect them from the enemies. If the shepherd fails to do his responsibility, the sheep will suffer.

Ezekiel declared that the shepherds of Israel had failed to fulfill their responsibilities to take care of them. These shepherds refer to the kings, nobles and religious leaders. They used their position for enriching themselves instead of helping the people.



Due to this, God said that He would take away their position and He Himself would take care of the sheep to guarantee they received good care. This is why He sent Jesus to be the good Shepherd who cares for you and me. Jesus, the good Shepherd who is willing to lay down His life for His sheep, like us.

Key verse:

Ezekiel 34:31 You are My sheep, the sheep of My grassland. You are only human beings, and I am your God." This is what the Lord God said.

Prayer

Lord Jesus, as You reign over all as King of kings, continue to shepherd me tenderly and closely as Your dear sheep. Amen.



HEART CLEANSER

One of the ways to clean a dirty basin is by using a sprinkle of baking soda and a cup of apple cider vinegar. Leave it for a few minutes and then clean it with a sponge. Rinse with water and the basin will look as clean as a new basin.

God told Ezekiel how He cleans people's hearts.

Secondly, He will give a new heart and a new spirit in us. It is like a heart transplant. He changes our old hardened heart into a new cleansed heart. A teachable heart that is willing to obey Him.

Key verse:

Ezekiel 36:29a I will save you from all your uncleanness.

CPR BRINGS BACK LIFE

There are ways to bring certain things that are already 'dying' to come to life again. For example, you can use a wet paper towel to soften the hard play-doh. You need some water to refresh a withered plant. CPR (an emergency procedure to restore spontaneous blood circulation and breathing in a person) is performed to help someone who is dying to be able to breathe again.

Ezekiel found that he could "perform CPR" on a bunch of dried bones by merely speaking God's word to them. The dry bones became alive. It proved how powerful and strong God's word is.

God's word is powerful, perfect and pure. His word brings life because Jesus is the Word of Life.

Dry bones represent hopeless situations. What dry bones are you having right now? Speak life to them and God shall restore your situation, from hopelessness to hopefulness. Command the dry bones to come back to life with God's powerful word.

Key verse:

Ezekiel 37:3 He asked me, "Son of man, can these bones live?" I said, "Sovereign Lord, You alone know."

Prayer

Dear God, I speak Your word to stir up the dry bones or the hopeless situation in my life. Thank You for equipping me with Your power through Your word. Amen
