AMOS 5:4-9

SEEK GOD AND LIVE

Bethel is the house of God. It is the location where Jacob dreamt of seeing angels and God.

Gilgal is a place of the new beginning. Gilgal was the first place where Israel camped in the land of promise and where Passover was celebrated.

Beersheba was the place where Abraham made a treaty with Abimelech, king of the Philistines in Gerar to form an alliance. Beersheba was a place where Isaac and Jacob came into contact with God.

Bethel, Gilgal and Beersheba symbolize big and memorable events that cause people to call upon the name of God.

Through Amos, God was saying that those events and places would not be able to help or rescue them although they might have had a powerful history that verified God's power. The only one who can save and rescue us is God alone.

We do not idolize people, memorable places or big events. We seek God in person to experience a fruitful and truthful life.

Key verse:

Amos 5:6a Come to the Lord and live.

AMOS 7:7-9

THE PLUMB LINE

n order to get a driving license, a person has to take an exam and ensure to pass the passing grade. If the result is below the passing grade, he fails. If the result is within or above the passing grade, he passes and will obtain the driving license.

The passing grade is the benchmark or standard of measurement. God showed Amos a plumb line to demonstrate that as God's people, we also have to live to a certain benchmark or standard. A plumb line is a line or a cord that has at one end a weight and is used to determine verticality. It is used mostly during making a wall to ensure that the wall is vertically straight by measuring the gap between the plumb line and the wall. If it is not equal all the way up, it means the wall is not yet straight and thus needs correction.

Our plumb line is God's word. God's words should be our standard of how we live. Ask the Holy Spirit to correct you each day so that you will always be in line with the word of God.

OBADIAH 1:8-15

DON'T REJOICE OVER OTHERS' MISFORTUNE

The Edomites are the descendants of Esau, while the Israelites are the descendants of Jacob. Esau and Jacob were twins. Edom was located at a very strategic location with rugged mountainous terrain that would be easily defended if they were attacked. It was also located at a crossroads where most trading and business took place. It made them rich and so prideful.

When the Israelites were invaded by the Babylonians, the Edomites didn't try to help them. Even worse, they gloated over the misfortune of Israel and helped the Babylonians loot the city and mistreat the people!

God showed a vision about Edom to the prophet Obadiah that due to their pride, violence, bad attitude and mistreatment to the Israelites, a big calamity would fall upon them and they would be driven away from their homeland by the Nabateans.

Let us learn from the Edomites' mistakes. Let's not gloat over other people's misfortune, including the person who has hurt us before. On the other hand, when someone else rejoices over our misfortune, remember that God is watching and will defend us with His own ways.

JONAH 1

YOU CAN NEVER RUN AWAY FROM GOD

od gave Jonah a task to go to Nineveh to remind the people to stop doing evil. However, Jonah was naughty. Instead of going to Nineveh, he went to Joppa which was the opposite route from Nineveh. He was running away from God. He was fleeing from God's plan.

Of course, nothing would stop God's plan. Nobody can escape God's plan. During Noah's journey, God sent a big storm that caused the people in the ship to throw Jonah into the sea! Only after he was thrown overboard did the sea stop raging. Due to this, Jonah was not able to continue his journey to Joppa.

There are things that we feel so difficult to do. Sometimes, it is indeed not easy to understand and follow God's calling. And sometimes, we might feel like running away from God's calling and following our own ways.

But always remember God loves you so much. You are His precious jewel. Obey Him and follow His calling upon your life till His glory shines through your life.

JONAH 2

RUNNING BACK TO GOD

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JONAH 3

A SMALL ACT OF OBEDIENCE CAN MAKE A BIG IMPACT

Finally, Jonah arrived in Nineveh! As soon as Jonah set foot in the city, he boldly preached God's word. God said that Nineveh would be destroyed in 40 days unless they were sorry and repented from their wickedness.

The king of Nineveh's response was surprising. He commanded everyone in his city to cry out to God and turn from their wickedness. He pleaded that God would turn away His punishment and show His mercy and kindness to them. Their sincere repentance melted away God's anger and God didn't punish Nineveh.

Jonah's obedience saved over 100,000 lives in Nineveh! Don't harden your heart when God asks you to do something.

You never know that your small act of obedience might mean the world to others. Your help might brighten someone's day. Your smile might cheer up someone's feeling. Your simple preach might give hope to someone. Your prayer might save someone's life. Your testimony might bless others who need to hear it.

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JONAH 4

GOD IS COMPASSIONATE

Jonah was unhappy when God forgave the people in Nineveh. Jonah felt the people of Nineveh did not deserve forgiveness as their wickedness was way too big. He could not understand why God gave them a second chance. He simply could not forgive the wrongdoing these people had done. Jonah was angry with God for forgiving them.

Unlike Jonah, God is full of compassion. Full of compassion means full of mercy, sympathy and pity to others. God had compassion over the people of Nineveh and was willing to give them a second chance when they repented and turned back to Him.

God is sympathetic toward the suffering of His people. God sees our distress and feels our misery. His compassion is more than mere sympathy and pity! God's compassion is related to His unfailing mercy, unlimited patience, amazing grace and forgiveness.

Let us have the same compassion as God! We can start by doing simple things like volunteering in an orphanage, holding the door of the elevator for the elderly or a disabled person, giving up our seat for a pregnant lady, etc.
