

JOHN 1:45-51

A LIFE LESSON FROM NATHANAEL

National was one of Jesus' first disciples. Before he met with Jesus, he only heard about Jesus from others. When he heard that Jesus, about whom Moses and the prophets had written, was from Nazareth, his first reaction was: "Can any good thing come out of Nazareth?" It sounds like he was looking down on Nazareth, because Nazareth was just a small town. What a prejudice!

A prejudice means an opinion that is formed without knowing or considering all the facts. Fortunately, Nathanael's prejudice didn't stay too long.

When he met Jesus face to face, he personally experienced that Jesus was indeed the Son of God. He believed that Jesus was the King of Israel. He erased the prejudice from his mind.

There are times when we have our own prejudice about someone or something. Let us respect and treat everyone we meet as a person that is loved by God.

Key verse:

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Psalm 141:2a Matthew 7:12 Do for others what you would want them to do for you. This is the meaning of the Law of Moses and the teaching of the prophets.

Prayer

Dear God, remind me always that everyone deserves to be respected and valued as a child of God. Amen.







JOHN 2:1-10



BE EXTRA-ORDINARY!

T here was a wedding in Cana. While the party was still ongoing, they ran out of wine. When Jesus heard about this, Jesus told the servants in the house to fill six water jars with water. They obeyed Jesus and guess what? The water inside the jars turned into wine! Jesus' miracle saved the party!

Jesus is a miracle worker! It normally takes a very long time and great patience to produce a very good grade of wine. However, with God's power in Jesus, He could produce it instantly!

Key verse:

John 2:11 What Jesus did here in Cana of Galilee was the first of the signs through which He revealed His glory; and His disciples believed in Him.

JOHN 4:13-15

THE SUPERNATURAL WATER

When we are thirsty, the first thing we need is water. Only drinking will satisfy our thirst. Jesus has a special kind of water to offer you and me. It is the supernatural water. The water He gives will be available constantly so that when we're thirsty, we can drink it immediately.

Sometimes when we are super thirsty, we are craving for sweet drinks like green tea or bubble milk tea. But, as these drinks are sweet, after drinking them, you will still feel thirsty and will be looking for pure water.

Likewise, when we try to find happiness and satisfaction in things that make us happy like toys, handphones, social media or hobbies, we might be able to feel happy for a while. However, this is just temporary.

The supernatural water that Jesus offers will become a spring of water in us that will lead us to eternal life, eternal happiness, eternal joy and peace. This supernatural water is His Holy Spirit. Ask Jesus to always fill you up with the Holy Spirit.

Key verse:

John 4:14 Indeed, the water I give them will become in them a spring of water welling up to eternal life.

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Prayer

Dear Jesus, I need Your supernatural water every day. Fill me with it so I will feel true joy and peace in my life. Amen.





JOHN 6:28-35

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THE BREAD OF LIFE

During those days, bread was the main food the people consumed. On that day, Jesus was teaching His disciples and He said, "I am the bread of life."

Bread can satisfy our hunger, give us strength or sustain us to keep us alive. This is what Jesus means when He says He is the bread of life. Jesus wants us to know that only He can satisfy our needs and hunger. Only Jesus can give us strength when we feel weak or tired. Only Jesus can sustain us no matter how hard our circumstance is. It is not gummy bears or French fries or chips that satisfy. It is merely Jesus.

Key verse:

John 6:35 I am the bread of life. Whoever comes to Me will never go hungry, and whoever believes in Me will never be thirsty

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Prayer

Dear Jesus, You are everything that I need that can satisfy my heart. I need You more than anything in my life. Amen.





JOHN 8:31-36

THE TRUTH SETS ME FREE

Key verse:

John 8:32 Then you will know the truth, and the truth will set you free.

JOHN 9:30-41

DON'T BE LIKE THE PHARISEES

Jesus healed a blind man who had been blind since he was born. However, the Pharisees kept questioning the man how Jesus healed him. Jesus then told them that even though they had seen what He did, they chose not to believe Him and they even influenced the people to reject Jesus.

Do not be like the Pharisees in this story. We have heard and read the word of God. We should be able to understand what is right and what is wrong. We have even experienced God's goodness in our life.

The Pharisees are like people who have eyes but cannot see things or have ears but cannot hear properly. It seems like their eyes and ears are being covered.

May our eyes always be open to see the light of Jesus in this darkened world. May our ears always be willing to listen to God's voice. We can hear His voice through His word or through other believers, like our parents and teachers.

Key verse:

John 9:5 While I am in the world, I am the light of the world.

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Prayer

JOHN 11:32-35

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JESUS WEPT TOO

The Bible records that Jesus wept over the death of Lazarus, His best friend. 'Jesus wept' was written in John 11:35, the shortest verse in the Bible. To weep means to shed tears.

This proves that Jesus feels what we feel. He felt empathetic to Mary and Martha for their loss. Jesus' weeping here shows His true care and love for Lazarus. He felt broken-hearted too. Jesus felt the sorrow and sadness of his friends, Mary and Martha. His heart was filled with compassion for them.

When we care about someone, we will love them sincerely. When they are hurt, you feel hurt too. This is what Jesus feels about each of us as well. He never takes our pain and tears lightly. When you cry or feel sad, do not feel that you are alone or think that no one understands you. Remember, Jesus understands. When He says He understands, He really does because He has been through it too. Psalm 51:17 says that God will not despise a broken heart.

Come to Jesus. He understands.

Key verse: John 11:35 Jesus wept.

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Prayer
