COOL

ACTS 3:1-10

IN JESUS' NAME

ACTS 5:12-16

MIRACLES, SIGNS AND WONDERS

A miracle is an event that takes place in the most unbelievable and almost impossible way. One example of a miracle is when Jesus turned water into wine (John 2:1-11). Jesus also performed miracles by healing so many sick people so that they all recovered from their illnesses.

A sign is a mark by which persons or things are made known. God gave signs to confirm His word here on earth. One example is the rainbow that appears in the sky after the rain. Each time you see a rainbow, you can remember that it's a sign from God, reminding us of His promises.

A wonder is a marvellous demonstration of God's power. A wonder can also be described as God's supernatural power breaking into the world we are living in, doing what is impossible to be explained by natural physical laws. One example of a wonder is when Moses parted the Red Sea so that the Israelites could walk through it on dry land. Another example is when Joshua stopped the sun during a battle.

God uses miracles, signs and wonders to prove that He is the all-powerful God in the past, in the present and forevermore.

ACTS 7:51-56

A LESSON FROM STEPHEN: BE BOLD AND NEVER HESITATES

Stephen was one of the seven people who were appointed by the apostles for the ministry (Acts 6:1-6). He was well-respected and had a very good reputation.

He was filled with the Holy spirit. He performed great wonders and signs among the people. He always gave wise answers to all questions given to him. He was bold and full of faith testifying about Jesus. He never hesitated to share about Jesus' kingdom. Because of this, many of the Jews didn't like him.

The end of Stephen's life might seem to be so sorrowful as he was stoned to death. However, while he was being persecuted, he said that he saw Jesus in Heaven, standing at the right hand of God.

Stephen was bold and he did not hesitate to share about his faith. It encourages us to stand up for our faith in Jesus, to be faithful to Him and to be sure that God will always be with us in every situation.

ACTS 9:1-15

THE CHOSEN INSTRUMENT

ACTS 11:22-24

LIFE LESSON FROM BARNABAS: AN ENCOURAGER

Barnabas was an encourager. An encourager is someone who strengthens or helps others to keep moving forward. Barnabas used his words to encourage the believers to remain true to the Lord with all their hearts.

It is not difficult to be an encourager. We can encourage others by highlighting the positive side in every situation, by giving praise to whom it is due and by giving advice when needed.

An encourager makes people feel hopeful when they have failed.

An encourager motivates people to keep going when they feel like giving up.

The Bible says that Barnabas was a good man, full of the Holy Spirit and faith. Through him, a great number of people were brought to the Lord.

If we have the characters of an encourager like Barnabas, we can be a blessing to many people and bring more people to Jesus. May God help us all to be an encourager.

ACTS 12:5-11

THE MOST POWERFUL WEAPON: PRAYER
