EXODUS 20-1-17

## GOD'S GOOD RULES

After wandering around for 3 months, the Israelites arrived at Mount Sinai for a temporary stay before continuing their journey to Canaan. One day, God asked Moses to come up to the top of Mount Sinai as God wanted to give him the Ten Commandments for the Israelites.

The Ten Commandments are as follows:

1. Do not have other gods beside the One true God;
2. Worship only God;
3. Use His name with respect;
4. Keep the Sabbath holy;
5. Honour your parents;
6. Do not murder;
7. Always be faithful to your husband or wife;
8. Do not steal;
9. Always tell the truth;
10. Be happy with what you have, do not be jealous.

God gave rules so that they knew how to live and to differentiate right and wrong. It was God's way to protect His people. Likewise, your parents have rules at home because they love you and want what is best for you.

Grain offering was about thankfulness to God's kindness. No matter how busy you are, you still have to find from the 168 hours you have to give thanks to Him for He is good.

Peace offering was about fellowship with God. Our peace offering is Jesus Christ who died once for you to make peace between you and God.

You are God's people and you must live differently than the world around you. May you be a pleasing sacrifice to our great God.
