1 KINGS 18:22-45

When Ahab reigned as the king of Israel, he worshipped a false god named Baal. It had been three years without rain in Israel. As per God's command, a man of God named Elijah challenged 450 Baal priests to see who the true GOD was, the Lord or Baal. They would each offer a sacrifice, and the God who would answer by fire would be proved to be the true God.

The Baal priests offered their sacrifice and they even hurt themselves so that their god would answer them, but there was no fire nor any answer. Elijah was alone. He built an altar with 12 stones, put some wood on it then laid some meat on the wood. He poured some water onto the wood three times. Theoretically, we cannot make fire out of something wet. INTEGRITY

King Jehoshaphat and King Ahab decided to fight the king of Aram. Before going to the battle, they asked for advice from Ahab's 400 prophets in the palace. These prophets said the kings would have victory over the king of Aram, but king Jehoshaphat was not convinced. He still asked for a prophet of God. Reluctantly, king Ahab called for a prophet of God, named Micaiah.

Micaiah always told the truth from God even though he knew it would irritate king Ahab. Because of his integrity, Micaiah was not liked by Ahab. He truthfully warned Ahab that he would lose the battle and he bravely revealed that the 400 prophets had not told the truth.

Integrity is a strong sense of honesty. Micaiah's courage and integrity make a good role model for you and me. He did not follow the crowd nor seek favour from people. Instead, he sought the true God and only did and said what pleased God.

People will not always like it when you tell the truth, especially if you say things they don't want to hear. But it is important to speak the truth. We live to please God not to please people.

SPEAK WISELY

A fter Elijah was lifted up to heaven, Elisha became his successor. He did many miracles and shared the word of God. When Elisha went to Bethel, he met some youths. They made fun of his appearance. They mocked him "baldhead". It was such a horrible word to say. They were making fun of a man of God.

Are you aware that making fun of people means making fun of God? Because God is their creator. Being made fun of feels so hurtful. It leaves unpleasant feelings and the scar of being humiliated can haunt the person for a very long time.

Your tongue might be small but the words that come out from the tongue are powerful. It can be encouraging or it can also destroy others. You can't control other people's tongues but you can control yours. Be careful with what you say.

If someone has ever made fun of you, find God to embrace and heal you. If you have ever made fun of others, ask for forgiveness from God and the one you have hurt.

2 KINGS 5:1-15

HUMILITY

wealthy army commander of Aram named Naaman had leprosy. His Israelite servant told Naaman's wife about Elisha who could heal Naaman His wife told him about it and Naaman went to Israel to find Elisha.

When Naaman waited outside of Flisha's house Elisha's servant came and told him to wash seven times in the Jordan River to be cured. Naaman was so used to being respected and served that he got offended by the way Elisha treated him. He was expecting Elisha, not Elisha's servant, to come and meet him personally. But due to his desperation to get healed, he put aside his pride. He dipped himself in the Jordan River seven times and was fully healed!

Because of Naaman's humility, he was healed. Humility is the willingness to not see yourself above anything or anyone. Naaman's humility to accept advice from a servant, to accept the way Elisha treated him and to dip his body into the muddy river was his way into healing! Had he refused to do all those, he would have missed the chance of being healed

Sometimes you need a little bit of humility to experience God's blessing that He had in store for VOU.

DON'T REPAY EVIL FOR EVIL

The king of Aram was enraged with Elisha so he sent his soldiers to capture him. When the Aramean army surrounded the city where Elisha was living, God sent horses and chariots of fire to protect Elisha and the people of Israel. God struck the Arameans with blindness and Elisha tricked them into following him to the city of Samaria, which is the Israel's territory.

When God opened their eyes again, the Arameans found themselves inside Samaria, captured by the King of Israel. Instead of killing the soldiers, Elisha told the king of Israel to prepare a great feast for them. When they had finished eating and drinking, the Elisha let them go back to their master.

Elisha was teaching the people to not always repay evil with evil. The purpose was to show the Arameans about God's mercy. By doing this, Elisha brought peace to both Israel and Aram.

This isn't an easy thing to do, especially when you have the opportunity to take revenge. But let the love of God do His way in your heart. God protects you from the enemy and He will give you power to show kindness to the enemy as well.

PRACTISE HOSPITALITY

Whenever Elisha and Gehazi, Elisha's servant, were in Shunem, there was a Shunammite woman who would show hospitality to them by providing a place to sleep and food to eat (2 Kings 4:8-10). Showing hospitality means being friendly and helpful.

One day, Elisha told the Shunammite woman to move to another place because he knew that there would be a famine in the land for 7 years. So, she and her family moved from that land so that they would not die of hunger.

After 7 years, she came back. Just before she went to meet the king to claim back her house and land that she had left vacant for 7 years, Gehazi was telling the king about the miracle that Elisha had ever performed to the woman's son. Because of this, not only did the king restore her land and house, he also gave her all of the income from the land from the last seven years!

The Shunammite woman showed heartfelt hospitality to Elisha. In return, God did not only protect her from famine, but He also rewarded her with big blessings. God will reward you for showing hospitality to others. You're not too young to practise hospitality. You can start now!

Key verse:

Romans 12:13 Share with the Lord's people who are in need. Practice hospitality.
