Once done Flisha asked him to take the arrows again and hit them to the around. He hit for 3 times only and it made Elisha angry. Elisha said Jehoash should have hit for 5 or 6 times so that he would strike the Syrians for 5 or 6 times and destroy them.

Due to this, King Jehoash would only manage to strike Syria for 3 times. It demonstrated that Jehoash had half-hearted faith in God. Had he used this opportunity to practise a whole-hearted faith, he would have conquered Syria completely.

Just like to Jehoash. God also gives you many arrows of help when problems arise. Through the Holy Spirit and His word, God will guide you on how to have a powerful prayer. Don't just pray three times and stop. Keep praying with a wholehearted faith till you get a complete victory over vour problems.
