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TIMEOUT TO COOL DOWN

When Esther found out about Haman's evil plan, she must have been furious and worried too. She gave herself a three-day timeout and spent it by fasting together with her servants. At the end of her fast, she was able to deal with Haman's threat to her people with a cool head. She managed to keep her anger under control. It was totally the opposite of Haman.

Determined to save her people, Queen Esther went to meet king Xerxes, although she had to risk her own life.
