
Key verse:



PUT YOUR TRUST IN GOD

od instructed Isaiah to walk around for three years without his sandals and sackcloth (an outer garment worn to show mourning or repentance). Can you imagine walking here and there without any proper clothes and footwear for three years? Isaiah must have been a laughing stock, feeling embarrassed and painful.

God had a purpose for this. It was to show Judah what would happen if they depended on other nations, namely Egypt and Ethiopia, for help, rather than on God.

According to the Bible, Assyria eventually attacked and won over Egypt and Ethiopia. The Egyptian and Ethiopian were taken away without clothes and sandals. They ended up being in the state like what Isaiah had demonstrated.

Sometimes we rely on our own strength or on other people. God wants you to rely fully on Him. Every day when you wake up, you have to decide that this day you will trust and depend on God no matter what


Key verse:

ISAIAH 22:1-14

ne day, you were in a rush to go to school. You chose to walk through the short but rocky path to reach school. However, because you were running, you stumbled on one of the rocks and fell down. You ended up having a bleeding knee and a torn school bag. After this incident, will you run again on that rocky path? Obviously, you've learnt your lesson and you will walk more carefully in the future.

These verses actually recorded how the Israelites tried to protect themselves from the enemies. They did all they could to defend themselves. They built ditches around the city, fortified it with walls, and some even ran away in fear.

But through it all, they refused to turn to GOD! They had experienced and witnessed God's help countless times yet they still hadn't learnt their lesson. Only when they were badly defeated did they start to turn back to God.

Don't be like the Israelites in this story. Do not ever refuse to listen to God. Learn your lesson well, and once. We don't have to be knocked down by hard lessons for many times first before we remember God, right?


Key verse:


Key verse:

Honesty pleases the heart of God. May honesty become your character since you are young. Let's grow in honesty.



ISAIAH 28:9-13

ave you seen your little brother or sister keep jumping up and down on the sofa and at the same time, your parents kept reminding them to stop jumping because they could fall down and bump their heads? However, they ignored your parents' warning and advice. Eventually, they really fell down and got injured.

These verses were like the above scenario. Isaiah had been reminding the priests and prophets. However, they complained that Isaiah's messages were useless and they ridiculed him as if he were a baby who could only babble with repeated phrases (Verse 10). In the end, God punished them for their scornful behaviour and sins. God imitated their mockery in His reply to them (Verse 13).

God's word and message might not always be pleasing to your ears BUT the value of God's word is priceless and it is given for your own good. His word is pure and truthful. May this become a warning to us not to make fun or mock on God's word and message.
